A FEW FACTS FOR 2019:

- * Standard deduction for single taxpayers - \$12,200
- * Standard deduction for married taxpayers filing a joint return - \$24,400
- * Standard deduction for head of household taxpayers - \$18,350
- * There are also additional amounts added to the standard deduction for people over 65 that meet certain criteria.
- * Beginning in 2018, you can no longer deduct EMPLOYEE BUSINESS EXPENSES. You can, however, deduct self-employed business expenses (ie: expenses you incur as a schedule C business owner).
- *** It is extremely important that you maintain, for your records, original statements, receipts, and other documents that support these expenses*****
